

Ceramic Studio Intern- Summer Camp

Start date: June 22, 2026

End date: September 4, 2026 (some flexibility may be available to accommodate school start dates)

Schedule: Monday-Friday, generally 9 am – 5 pm

Application deadline: Applications accepted on a rolling basis until the position is filled.

The Center for Contemporary Art seeks a responsible Ceramic Studio Intern to support its summer camp program. The intern will work under the supervision of the Center's ceramics teaching faculty, Ceramics Program Director, and Ceramics Technicians. This position offers practical studio experience, exposure to educational programming, and an opportunity to learn how a professional ceramics studio operates.

Essential Job Functions

- Wedge and prepare clay, glazes, and other materials as needed
- Load, unload, and fire kilns as instructed by the Ceramics Program Manager.
- Clean wheels, tables, floors, and sinks between each class
- Clean all surfaces and mop at the end of each day
- Label all student work with name and class number
- Organize finished projects for parents to pick up

Marginal Job Functions

- Work one-on-one with children to assist as needed
- Eat lunch with children/assist with monitoring children during their lunch break

Qualifications/Attributes

- Have basic ceramic experience and knowledge of, or a desire to learn, wedging, centering, and forming clay vessels using the wheel and hand-building, firing kilns, and studio maintenance.
- Have experience and enjoy working with children
- Be reliable, responsible, accountable, and have a positive attitude
- Be able to regularly lift 50 lbs. of clay

Schedule & Salary

- Must be available to work from June 22 through September 4, 2026. Some flexibility may be available to accommodate school start dates.

- Approximately 40 hours per week. Some evenings may be required to adhere to the kiln firing schedule.
- Weekly gross stipend of \$637.00.
